



Gianni Marinucci

JAZZ ENSEMBLE AND INSTRUMENTAL CLINICIAN

Yamaha Music Australia trumpet artist Gianni Marinucci is one of Melbourne's busiest musicians. He has performed with many of Australia's finest jazz musicians such as Don Burrows and Tony Gould. His quartet and trio have been the featured act at many jazz clubs and festivals such as; Bennett's Lane, Dizzy's, The Melbourne International Jazz Festival and the Italian Jazz Festival. He is also a busy freelance musician playing in a wide range of groups such as the 5+2 Brass project and "Gonebanda".

In 1998, Gianni was recorded by the ABC for use on Jim Macleod's 'Jazztrack' program. His debut CD; "The Sound of My Voice" was released in 1999, to excellent reviews. In September/October of 1999 Gianni completed a hugely successful tour through Germany with his group 'The Marinucci Trio', playing at many jazz clubs such as the famous 'B-Flat' in Berlin.

In 2001 Gianni was the featured performer in "Lets get Lost" a concert tribute to Chet Baker, which was played on both ABC television and radio. Gianni was a featured performer at the 2003 and 2004 Italian Jazz Festival, and the 2003 Melbourne International Jazz Festival, and was a member of the "Grand Union Orchestra" for the 2004 Melbourne Jazz Festival, as well as the Moovin And Groovin Orchestra for the Umbria Jazz in Melbourne Festival 2005.

His group "Gonebanda" which blends jazz influences with Italian folk music has appeared at various festivals including the 2005 Apollo Bay Music festival. They released their debut CD "From Here to There" in 2005.

In 2006, Gianni took part in a very successful tour of Thailand with his quartet, and was also a featured performer at the Melbourne International Festival Of Brass . His quartet was also featured at the Wangarratta Jazz Festival in 2006. Gianni is also a highly skilled educator. He holds a Bachelor of Education (music-classroom/instrumental method), and has been teaching both privately and in schools for 10 years. Gianni was involved in teaching the "jazzworx" improvisation program, and is often employed as a jazz tutor. In 2001 Gianni was the Jazz tutor for the Melbourne Bands Festival, and in 2003 was a clinician at the 'Sounds Great' teachers' conference.

An extremely lyrical player, he is renowned for his interpretation of songs and is also a gifted composer and vocalist.
